Conservative candidate Rick Perkins is the current Member of Parliament, winning the seat in 2021. Perkins has served as Shadow Minister for Fisheries, Shadow Minister for Innovation Science and Industry, and served on several committees during his time in Ottawa.

People's Party of Canada (PPC) candidate Patrick Boyd is an international executive with experience running large complex projects around the world in both the energy and financial

Astor Theatre receives \$500k commitment

LIVERPOOL – The J&W Murphy Foundation has given a commitment of \$500,000 (\$100,000 per year) over the next five years to the historic Astor Theatre.

Lynn Cochrane, vice chair, the Astor Theatre Society, said "it's going to be life-changing for the theatre."

She said they have been talking to the Murphy Foundation for close to a year and they made a commitment "to support us back in October" and work began to put something together with the family "to make sure it was something they could get

behind. The big thing was that they wanted to support the operations of the theatre to make it more sustainable."

Lisa Murphy, chair of the foundation said, by email, that "too often, community-based arts organizations like the Astor Theatre Society are forced to operate in survival mode, scrambling each month just to keep the lights on. That kind of pressure makes it nearly impossible to think beyond the immediate."

"With this multi-year investment, the J&W Murphy Foundation hopes to help the Astor Theatre Society bring stability to their financial planning, and the breathing room to focus on the big picture: ensuring that the arts - and the Astor - are a vibrant

part of our community's fabric for decades to come."

The J&W Murphy Foundation was established in 2008 by the late Janet and Dr. William Murphy, longtime Liverpool residents. Dr. Murphy co-founded the thriving Mersey Seafoods in 1964.

Cochrane said they have laid out a five-year plan for the funding. For the first year of funding, she said they are focusing on three core items.

The first being fund development, establishing a sustainable program for the building. She said they will spend some money to employ a consultant to put that in place.

services sectors. Boyd said, “I understand global business, but I also understand how globalist policies are impacting everyday life for Nova Scotians.”

2. How will you apply that experience to the role as MP?

Boyd identifies himself as a problem solver who believes in speaking plainly. In his view, “our province is suffering in large part due to poorly thought out immigration and economic policies that are focused more on ideology than prosperity. The solutions to address these issues, while potentially uncomfortable to discuss, are equally clear—end unskilled immigration that disenfranchise locals and lower taxes & regulations that suppress industry.”

3. What are the biggest issues you are hearing from constituents on the doorstep?

Once again, Boyd identifies immigration as a widespread concern from constituents across the South Shore - St. Margarets riding. He says the Temporary Foreign Worker Program has allowed, “a clear shift in the demographics of entry level retail workers across the province.”

Boyd said, “Canada’s GDP Per Capita has been declining for seven quarters and counting and one does not have to look far to understand why.” (Editor’s note: GDP Per Capita actually increased for Q2 and Q4, 2024. See: Statistics Canada Table 36-10-0706-01 Gross domestic product per capita and other per capita macroeconomic indicators)

4. What’s your (or your party’s) plan to address those concerns?

Boyd said the PPC will impose an Immigration Moratorium to allow infrastructure and services to catch-up to demand. Boyd said, “We don’t need to import people to flip burgers, pour coffee, or stock shelves; instead, we should be importing people who already possess the skills that are in demand and where we have shortages. Immigration works for all involved when done properly.”

2. How will you apply that experience to the role as MP?

Perkins says the role of an MP is bigger than what the public sees in the House of Commons during “the short clips, the punchy lines in Question Period where you have 35 seconds to ask a question. But a lot of the real work goes on in committees, and because it was a minority government, I got to work with some great MPs on all sides but particularly in the NDP Bloc and the opposition to get stuff done.” Perkins says parties worked together

to compromise and pass legislation. “If you’re a reasonable person and approaching issues in a reasonable way... you can get stuff done in parliament no matter what the public sees happening.”

3. What are the biggest issues you are hearing from constituents on the doorstep?

Perkins says this is his third election campaign and every one of them has been different. This time affordable housing and cost of living are top of voters’ minds but they’re also reacting in real time to the actions of US President Donald Trump. He

says, “what Trump is doing is he’s drawing attention to the fact that we have a weak economy after 10 years of these Liberals, and people aren’t looking for a fourth term of Liberal failed economic policy.” Perkins says people are anxious that Trump’s actions will make Canada’s economy even worse.

4. What’s your (or your party’s) plan to address those concerns?

Perkins says the Conservatives have released a detailed, comprehensive platform that will supercharge the economy and create more jobs with higher paycheques.

2. How will you apply that experience to the role as MP?

“I bring a lot of experience and lessons learned from that field that I think I can use to develop and implement new policies for the South Shore as well as legislation.” Embrett says his PhD training will be useful, “I’ll be able to interpret and analyze complicated data trying to communicate it simply to the public, so they stay informed,” said Embrett. “I think I have the skills and the will to

listen to people, take their considerations seriously, and represent those considerations and those issues as an MP.”

3. What are the biggest issues you are hearing from constituents on the doorstep?

Affordable housing and cost of living are the top of the lists, environmental issues and what role government can play as well as the economic trade war with the United States. Embrett says the Green Party position is, “really not to get dragged

into the trade war but instead to lead and find solutions within Canada.” Embrett says these problems are tied together and need to be addressed.

4. What’s your (or your party’s) plan to address those concerns?

Embrett says the Green Party represents bold change and people get really excited about that. “Even if winning the election might seem far-fetched for the Green Party, I think just having us at the table and just having people listen to us is really welcomed by the public.”

points, let’s get the facts and do the research and review, send me in the boardroom and I’m coming out with something.”

2. How will you apply that experience to the role as MP?

Fancy-Landry says representatives need to involve constituents

when coming up with any solution, “If someone says to me how does that help me, I say you’re becoming part of the process. And when you become part of the process it empowers you to make positive change in your community and that’s what I’m all about.”

3. What are the biggest issues you are hearing from constituents on the doorstep?

Fancy-Landry has identified three big issues when speaking with people, fisheries, housing and affordability, and tariffs and Trump.

4. What’s your (or your party’s) plan to address those concerns?

Fancy-Landry echoed Liberal party leader Carney who said that DFO needs to get closer to the wharf to ensure rules are being applied fairly for all. Canada needs to drive its own economy forward with a balanced plan that is fiscally responsible and socially aware.

Fancy-Landry says the sense she is hearing from everyone at the doors is that the divisiveness and aggressiveness across party lines needs to stop. “People are ready to just say, cut the cr#p. Let’s roll up to the table together and do what government is supposed to do which is make the best choices for the people and the country. It’s time to start working together, better.”

Man charged in murder attempt

QUEENS – The Queens District RCMP recently charged a man with attempt to commit murder.
On March 28 at approximately 3:30 a.m., RCMP officers and EHS responded to a weapons call at a home on Hwy. 3 in Mill Village. When officers arrived at the scene, they located a man with life-threatening injuries and learned that another man had left in a vehicle. The victim was transported to hospital by EHS.
At approximately 7:45 a.m., officers located the suspect at home in Vogler’s Cove and he was safely arrested.

Investigators have determined that the victim, an 84-year-old man, sustained injuries consistent with being stabbed. The men were known to each other and no one else was inside the home at the time of the incident.
Derek Dominix, age 60, of Mill Village, was charged with Attempt to Commit Murder and was remanded into custody. He will appear in Bridgewater Provincial Court on April 10, 2025 at 9:30 a.m.
The investigation is continuing and is being led by Queens District RCMP with support from RCMP Forensic Identification Section and the Southwest Nova RCMP Major Crime Unit.

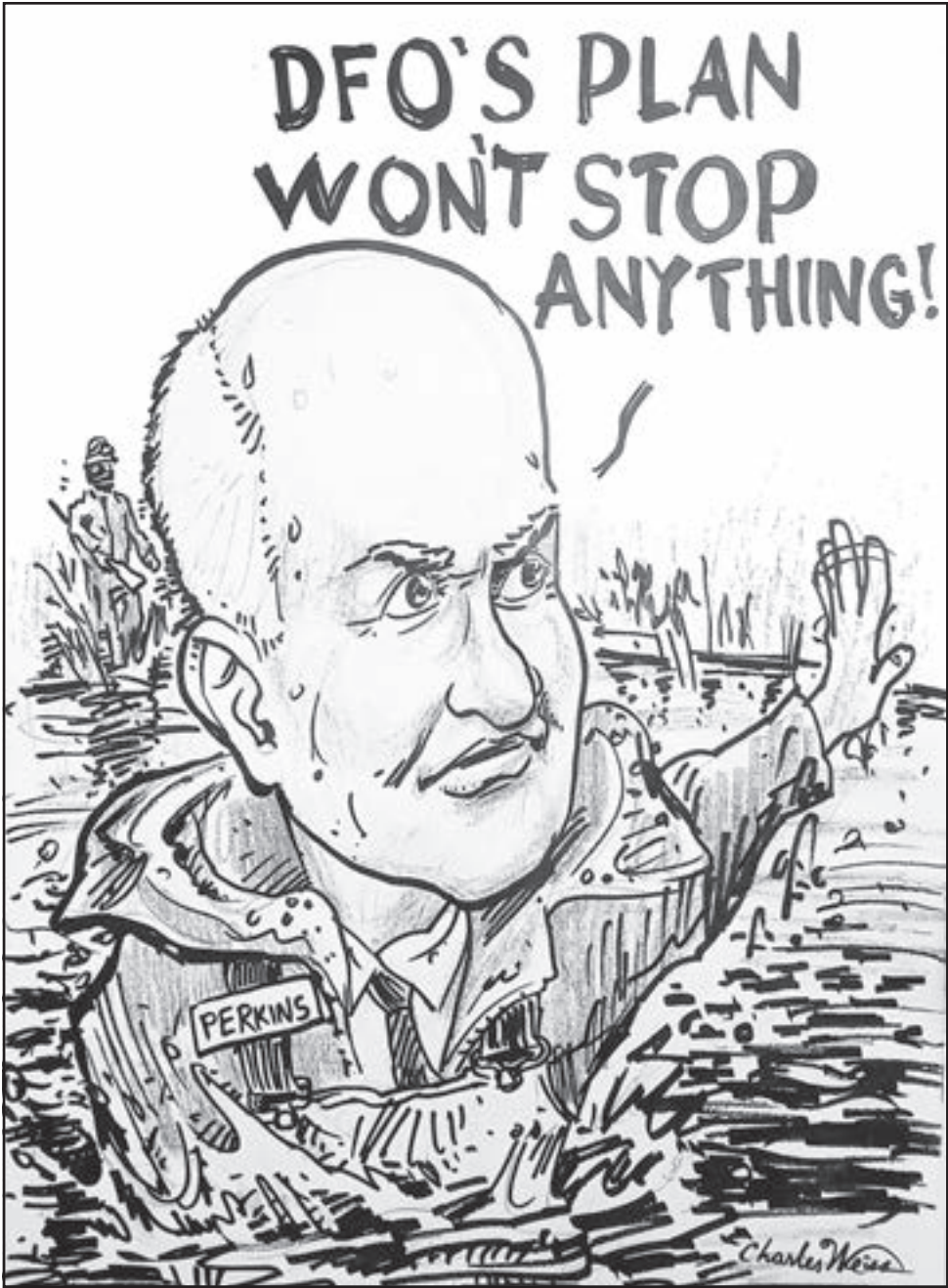

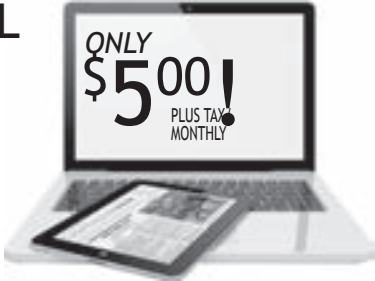

Town of Bridgewater: April 28 - May 2 Collected on your regular collection day.

Town of Mahone Bay: Monday, May 12 Entire Town collected on this day.

Collection Guidelines for Towns:
Maximum of 2 cubic metres (2m x 2m x 1m) collected. **Branches: must be bundled, individual branches up to 90 cm (3 feet) long and 5 cm (2 inches) in diameter.** Bagged leaves and bundled branches: up to 25 kgs (55 lbs) each. **Leaves may be put in your green cart.**

District of Lunenburg:
Leaf & yard waste collected year-round, on your regular collection day. Maximum of 3 bags or bundles of branches collected when your green cart is curbside and 4 bags or bundles when your cart isn't curbside.

Lumberjacks battle hard, but drop Game 7

BRIDGEWATER – The South Shore Jr. Lumberjacks dropped a 5-3, Game 7 decision to the hometown Capstone Colts in Shearwater April 2 in the Fred Fox Division finals.

The Colts now move on to play the Antigonish Bulldogs in the Nova Scotia Junior Hockey League finals.

The Lumberjacks were up 2-0 in the series. In game seven, Joe Osborne would crack the egg with the lone goal in the opening frame. In the second, the Colts would score two in the first half to take a 2-1 lead.

Dawson O’Connell would knot the score at two, scoring at the 4:07 mark.

In the final frame, the teams exchanged goals with Osborne scoring his second of the night at the 9:05 mark of the period, on the power play.

The Colts would add one more at the 7:04 mark to take the lead for good. They would add an empty-netter to close things out.

Kegan Greencorn stopped 24/28 shots on net, while the Lumberjacks fired 38 shots at Conar Brace on the other end.

Coach Joel Isenor, who came on as head coach of the Lumberjacks in January, said the guys gave it all they had.

“I feel the guys laid it all out there and we were just a goal short and maybe if you can pick any problem – we only scored one power play goal and it was in game seven,” he said.

“All in all, I’m pleased the way the kids responded, I’m pleased by the way the kids were resilient and they showed a lot of heart throughout the year and leading into playoffs. The fans should be very proud the way they played and very excited about the team coming next year.”

The team will lose just four players – Joe Osbourne, Daniel Kline, Aaron Lane and John Shubaly.

“I wish them all the best. They had an unbelievable year. I told them that you should hold their heads up very high because of what they accomplished,” said Isenor. “They will be a huge loss for us, like they would any other team.”

Looking back on the second half of the season, Isenor said the guys improved a lot.

“There were a couple of things I wanted to tweak. I told the guys I don’t want to come in and change you 100 per cent, but just tweak a few things. I told them that I just wanted them to get better each day, that’s all you can do, and they did,” he said.

He said there were several areas they improved upon such as taking penalties, improving on face-offs, learning exactly what their jobs were on certain plays and figuring out the d-zone.

“I felt that they did get better each day and leading up to the playoffs, I don’t think anybody really expected us to go as far as we did,” said Isenor. “But we thought we could go as far as we did and even more.”

Looking back to the East Hants series he thought the Penguins wanted to avoid them, because they could expose their weaknesses.

“They had an unbelievable season, losing four games and they were the top team in the division, hands down. But when you take little aspects of their game and expose their weaknesses, it hinders them.”

Isenor said in this case, it was their goaltender that they could expose, thinking that he didn’t really feel pressure during the season, and the defence, outside of 6’4” tall Noah Comeau, could be taken advantage of.

“I just told the guys that we must play old-style hockey and all we have to do is beat them in game seven. Don’t worry about games one, two, three or four, just go game-by-game and beat them in game seven,” he said.

The Lumberjacks did better than that and it took them just five games to take the series from the number one team in the division.

“I think we surprised them by the way we played, and in my eyes, they didn’t know how to react.”

A couple of keys, besides exposing their weak spots, was the domination in the face-off dot. Isenor said they won 75 per cent of the face-offs; another was the special teams. He said they scored seven or eight powerplay goals and two shorthanded goals, while allowing just two powerplay goals against.

The Lumberjacks continued to roll into the division finals taking the first two games by scores of 3-1 and 3-2.

“We were pretty much going up against a team that played the same style as the Penguins, but with a strong offence. We got off to a good start, but then we hit a little lag where we had a couple of banged up bodies, no excuses,” he said.

Owner Jim Bottomley was proud of the guys.

“It turned out to be a great season. We went with a younger group and they played well, finishing fourth in the division and they did some damage in the playoffs,” he said.

This is the second season for the Jr. B Lumberjacks after moving over from Liverpool where they were located for a decade and known as the Privateers.

Bottomley gave a lot of the credit to hard work of the volunteers who show up each night to make it a great experience for the fans.

“Everyone in the area has been supportive of the hockey club and the volunteers put a lot of time and effort to make each game night a success,” he said, adding credit to all the fans who come out and watch the team both at home and on the road.

He also credits the sponsors that have backed the team for the last two years.

“Everyone we contact is more than willing to support the team and in return we try our best to put a competitive team on the ice that has a chance to win every year,” he said.

Bottomley also credited Coach Isenor for his work.

“He stepped into the role, and I think he was a major factor in our team’s success. There was a big turnaround – our game improved, our goals against came down and we were competitive in every game heading down the back stretch into the playoffs,” said Bottomley.

“In the playoffs he had them prepared for every game and every series. His experience as a player and a coach really reflected amongst the boys.”

Will he be back?

“We’re hoping he will come back. I think he really enjoyed it. I’m a betting man and I will bet that he comes back,” said Bottomley.

Isenor said this is something that he will be discussing with Bottomley in the near future.

Bluenosers unite!

Lunenburg man wants to unite Nova Scotians worldwide

THE WORLD – Sean Meister wants to build a community of Nova Scotians living outside of the province. “This is what I was built to do. It’s really unique and it’s very weird,” he said. “It’s not a job that someone is going to create, it’s not an organization that just anyone can start. It takes a different way of thinking,” said Meister.

The 40-year-old who grew up in New Ross grew an idea into a concrete reality that is gaining momentum.

He is the founder and CEO of Global Bluenosers, a member-focused, non-profit organization that is focused on building a community of Nova Scotians living beyond Nova Scotia.

HIS STORY

Meister grew up in New Ross on a family farm working in forestry and farming.

After graduating high school, he went to Acadia and the day after convocation, he spent the next 10 years working in the field of public relations for universities and colleges in Alberta and Ontario.

He returned to Nova Scotia with his family in 2017 and purchased a home just outside of Lunenburg. He would spend the next five years working in economic development for the province.

THE ORIGINS

But he moved away from this and that’s where the Global Bluenosers’ story begins.

“The roots of it traced back to me being away and the interest of building a community outside of the province really started from my own desire to find other Nova Scotians,” he said. “I started to find some and soon realized that it was really just us and New-foundlanders that still talked about where we were from, as ‘home’, even if it was 20 years later.”

He said that everyone else he met sort of assimilated into the area where they were currently living.

“I would ask people where they were from and they

would say, ‘I’m from Calgary’, so you were born and raised in Calgary, they would say, ‘no, I was born and raised in Manitoba,’” said Meister.

“But Nova Scotians, when I would ask where they were from, they would say, ‘I am from Sydney,’ then I would ask if they were visiting and they would say ‘No, I’ve been here 30 years.’”

Nova Scotians have a strong affinity to home and that piqued his interest.

During the pandemic, he posted a lot online about the province and kept it positive, talking about how happy he was to be living here. He began receiving a lot of emails from Nova Scotians flooding his inbox wanting to talk about home, because they couldn’t visit.

“It just reinforced how close we are,” he said, adding that there were a wide variety of people reaching out to him, whether they were born and raised in the province, or had lived here for a bit, or had family here.

“I always say, we are Nova Scotians either by birth or by choice. You can be a Nova Scotian in many different ways,” he said.

FROM A PODCAST

To tell these stories, he decided to start a podcast in 2023 to share some of the many conversations that he had been having.

“This very quickly evolved to where I put the podcast on pause, just to focus on starting to create in-person experiences,” said Meister.

And that he did.

TO A KITCHEN FEST

“So, I thought that if I threw a professional-themed kitchen party somewhere in the world, Nova Scotians would show up,” he added.

Meister then put together a party for Bluenosers in Dallas and he said there was a great turnout and it has carried on its own momentum.

He has now hosted six events in four different countries including Canada with hundreds of people attending.

“It’s really gathered its own steam which is why I decided to incorporate as a not-for-profit organization in October 2024 to create some structure around it.”

The next events will be held in Calgary in July and Dubai in the fall.

DID HE EVER IMAGINE?

When asked if he thought something simple like Facebook postings and a podcast would involve into what it is...

“No, no. This was me having a unique interest. I absolutely love talking to Nova Scotians that live away, because they offer such a unique perspective,” he said.

“Also from a business perspective, it’s fascinating. So much of what I’ve done internationally, I’ve been able to do because I can call a Nova Scotian. If I’m going to get off a plane somewhere, I call a Nova Scotian and say this is what I need and they’re like, ‘let me make some calls. So, it’s been a fascinating piece of like how if you don’t look at Nova Scotia as a border, but just as an identity, how fascinating that can be and how strong that could be for us as a province.”

He said that the people that attend these gatherings

come from such a wide variety of backgrounds, but yet have that connection of having Nova Scotia be a part of them.

“We get everyone from a new graduate that just landed in a city to a CEO of a company. It’s people that are at all stages of their careers and the only stipulation for entry is – has Nova Scotia played a part in your life? This is why Bluenosers is in the name,” said Meister.

He said they have so many people that may have just visited the province, but the atmosphere, the culture just resonated with them...they will come to events.

“In Dallas, that’s what it was. I just reached out to people in the community that had connections and they signed up. But the most common thing they say, ‘I don’t think there are any other Nova Scotians here. Then I will be like, ‘I’m going to show you some.’”

He said it’s about ordinary and business people finding a sense of belonging where they are now living.

The ‘gatherings’ or social events come relatively easy, if you let it be.

The last gathering in London was at a pub owned by a guy from Nova Scotia. He happily hosted us and promoted the event.

“I try and find a venue that has that connection, which takes some research. Over the past decade I’ve spent a lot of time digging into where we are clustered, then I target those cities.”

He then reaches out to some contacts in the area, who start promoting, and then he starts promoting, largely on the LinkedIn platform.

The event in London had well over 100 people sign up and close to 90 attended.

He said the response has been great no matter where the events happen.

“That’s one thing I can count on. Even if someone can’t come out to an event, they’re excited to know that there’s something happening around them – something Nova Scotian.”

As the organization continues to grow, Meister said that he wants to work on building the connections that are made between these larger events that happen two or three times a year.

“How do we make sure that people have access to that community on an ongoing basis so that everyone has what I have,” he said. “I can just open my phone and reach out somebody in any part of the world – any Nova Scotian living anywhere in the world can find another Nova Scotian anywhere and build that connection.”

In his five-year plan he said that he wants Global Bluenosers to become the largest group of Nova Scotians outside of the province. He wants to build it to a scale where all Nova Scotians can have access to each other anywhere.

Then he wants it to be at a place where the business community can form relationships (another angle) to promote tourism and economic development for Nova Scotia.

“I see each and every member of the organization that is living abroad, as an ambassador for Nova Scotia. While they are getting the value of being able

to connect to one another, there’s also this strong sense within the community of wanting to give back, because they’ll attribute part of their success to having been from or have some connection to the province.”

Not all this work and travel comes without a cost. He said that he dug deep into his pockets to start the project and has formed partnerships with the Halifax Stanfield airport, Acadia University and realtor Nick Ogden from Halifax.

“When you have a belief in something you find a way to do it. Very quickly I found a group of partners that were willing to sponsor events and activities. We don’t have any government funding, so we’re very much working on a community-driven model.”

Currently, he and his board are working on building a membership program to join the community and things like merchandise will become available.

“It has grown from personal credit cards to now a revenue model, so thankfully I can say that I have gone through that evolution as a start-up and it has gotten to the point where it’s really starting to take off.”

INSPIRATIONAL

He said that very few provinces and countries are doing this type of thing. In Canada there is a diaspora engagement in the rest of the world – those communities outside of your homeland

that can include ex-pats, alumni, heritage folks.

“Other parts of the world have been good at activating their diaspora, so I draw a lot of inspiration from Ireland, Scotland, Wales, New Zealand, Vietnam, Singapore and India and there is a new group in South Korea.

“There are a lot of examples of how other countries and regions of the world have built structures around how to build community and then leverage those communities to bring value back home in an authentic way.”

He said it’s not transactional, but it’s about relationships and the community.

He said his model of community is watching firefighter breakfasts, where people get together to support the cause.

“Everyone has this understanding of the role they play and they give back,” adding that we engage with diaspora within Canada, but do less about engaging communities of Canadian outside of the country.

He said research show that there are about four million Canadians living outside of the country, amongst that number, he estimates there are about 250 to 300,000 Nova Scotians.

How do you get involved? As stated before, there will be individual memberships that will be available along with corporate memberships. Partnerships are always welcome and you can follow along on the journey through Facebook, Instagram and LinkedIn.

DREAM JOB?

“It is a dream because so much of it is focused on strengthening Nova Scotia, which has been my driving force my whole life, but especially since I moved home.

“How do we make Nova Scotia stronger. How do we drive forward and become everything that we can be. And I really have a strong belief that this community is a huge part of what has been missing from the equation.

“They can add so much from their perspectives and their expertise and their emotional connections and their desire to give. That’s something that can unlock so much opportunity and I think in the current climate, especially

so, because as things kind of go in an interesting direction with some of our trading partners it’s a lot easier to make a call to somebody in a country that you want to start doing export sales to and get an introduction quickly rather than start from square one rather than have to start from square one.

“I guess I need to start the research, no I need to make a sale tomorrow. Let’s see if I know someone from Lunenburg that is living in London and give them a call. It has that real strong impact potential that’s what makes me not able to give up on it.

“It can do something good for the province. That’s the impact I want to have.”

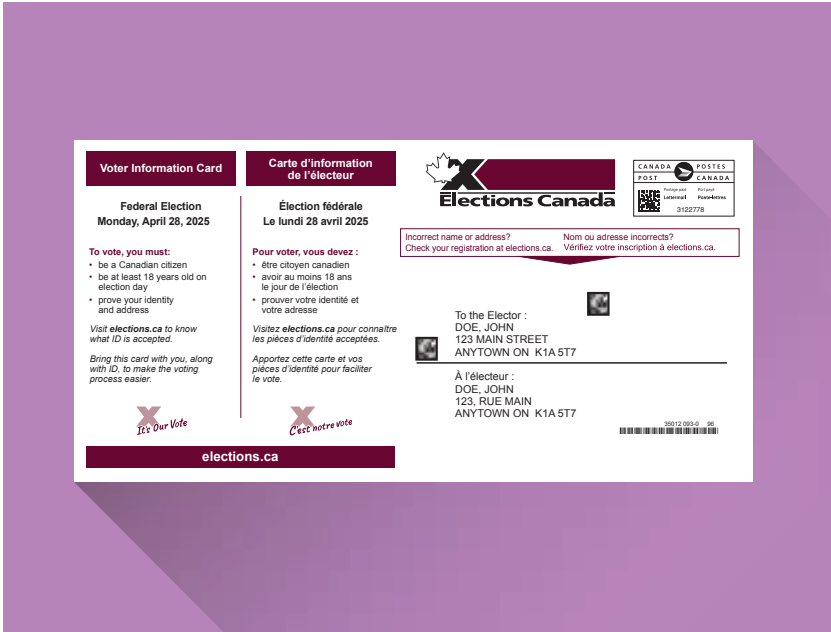

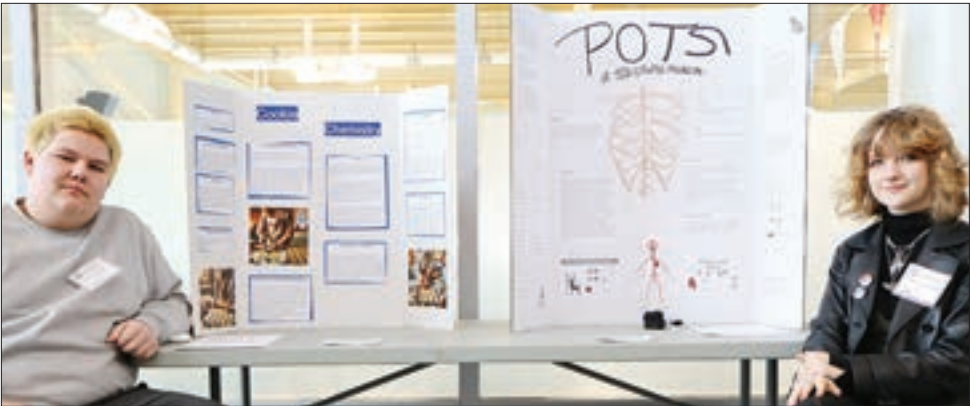

Mother-daughter experience World Games for the first time

SOUTH SHORE – Special Olympics Lunenburg/Queens was well represented at the 2025 Special Olympic Games that were held in Italy last month.

Four athletes were among the 90 that made up Team Canada at the Games, along with Coach Susan Inglis.

The athletes included Inglis’s daughter, Rebecca Delaney, along with Chloe Stoddart, Nicholas Skoreyko and Jillian Young.

It was an obvious highlight for Inglis and Delaney to enjoy their first World Games together.

Overall...

Inglis said that it “was a pretty amazing experience. It was quite a trip. For some of them, like Jillian from Liverpool, she had never been outside of the country before. In fact, last year at nationals in Calgary, it was her first time being on a plane.

“For her to go away for 15 days to another country and be away from her parents for that amount of time was a big accomplishment.”

It started off for the Nova Scotia contingent, leaving the province March 3 to meet up with the rest of Team Canada in Toronto to prepare for their 15-day overseas adventure. They left for Turin March 15.

They flew on a couple of different

planes to get to their destination.

“We then arrived and had a couple of days Turin, including one day to tour around in smaller groups which was nice,” said Inglis. “We also tried out the famous Italian gelato.”

They then took part in the opening ceremonies, something special that Inglis had been anticipating since she was chosen to go as a coach.

“The fact that you walk in wearing your country’s colours, representing your country, I knew it was going to be an emotional experience and it really was,” she said. “There was a big contingent of family and friends there and they must have found each other and sat in the same area. There were flags flying and cheering, it was great.”

She added that it was amazing to see all of the athletes from all of the countries, some that she had never even heard of. It was great especially to see some of the countries that were coming from sad circumstances but still managed to send some athletes.

Then it was off to compete. They travelled to Sestriere, the highest point in Italy.

“It took a bit to get used to, but it was a beautiful area. Everywhere we looked, we were sounded by mountains,” said Inglis.

The athletes then did some divisioning races that would decide who the athletes would compete against in the final races.

They then began their races and they had to endure some crazy weather.

“It can be beautiful and sunny, then all of a sudden you could see weather coming and it would turn into an absolute snowstorm,” said Inglis, adding that she got sunburned a few times. “The last two days they competed they were running in snowstorms. For the relay, you couldn’t even see the person in front of you.”

Overall, she felt the athletes handled the whole trip very well, despite having to go through many ‘new’ things that many of them haven’t been through before, such as going through customs, eating different food and getting up really early to catch flights.

“They were all interested to see and the competition at the world level. For them to see that they can compete at that level, it was pretty impressive and our Team Canada dominated on the snowshoe podium,” said Inglis.

She added that they had two pre-event training camps and had been training two or three days per week of the last nine or 10 months and she said it was definitely worth it.

“To see how they measured up with people from across the world was pretty cool and I think it boosted their confidence and they all had personal bests. All that training really paid off.”

Inglis said the highlight of the trip for her as a coach was to experience the event through the eyes of the athletes from across the country. She said that the Canadian team had spent a lot of time together and became like family.

She said it was also great, this being her first world games, to learn from other coaches.

As a parent – seeing her daughter earn a gold medal was definitely a highlight.

Astor Theatre receives \$500k commitment

The second is to boost the theatre’s revenues, so putting together a good marketing and communications plan, something that would include re-branding, newsletters, social media, launching a new website and a comprehensive community outreach program.

The third item on the list is programming. “We are inclusive with our programming now, but we want to broaden it and try to raise the level of entertainment. We are a 350-seat theatre – I think the third largest in Nova Scotia...so we feel that maybe some of the acts that are coming to Halifax might be interested in coming to the South Shore.”

Cochrane said the second year of funding would be focused on cementing the first-year objectives with an emphasis on broadening the program offerings, not just for the theatre, but for the arts and cultural centre as well.

“We have a lot of youth and seniors’ programs that we want to bolster. We also have some accessibility issues with the town hall that we want to work on,” she said.

They also want to get an HVAC installed in the theatre so that the building can be operating comfortably for 12 months of the year.

Skip to year five, Cochrane said that they want to work on the sustainability of the upcoming projects in the first four years.

“We will be just broadening and tightening things up to make sure that the theatre is financially stable and that we have programming that interests a wide group of people so we can get more bums in the seats,” she said.

“It’s a very iconic, important building to not only the town of Liverpool, but the whole of the South Shore. It’s also a very important building to the Murphy family, who have had a long connection to the theatre like many Liverpooldians. They have been a part of Liverpool for many generations and they have been very considerate and supportive of things that go on in their hometown, which we truly appreciate.”

THE ASTOR THEATRE

This theatre opened in 1902 and was originally known as the Liverpool Opera House, and it is Nova Scotia’s oldest performing arts theatre. It hosted local and touring shows until silent films were introduced in 1917.

A field trip and what migrants to expect next

Some people refer to Cape Sable Island, Yarmouth and Baccaro as the Banana Belt of Nova Scotia and when we have snow, they are still green, but not this winter!

It was very different with them getting snowstorms and not us or their getting way more snow than us. Anyhow, my purpose for mentioning it is that I made about three or four trips into the Banana Belt since Dec. 1 and every time that I went, it was snowy and foggy.

March 29 was no exception.

The field trip was supposed to include Port Clyde, the Blanche Peninsula and Baccaro. I decided this time to make a side trip to Cape Sable Island as I wanted to see the brant before they left the area. I was successful, but photos left much to be desired due to how hard it was snowing when I did find them.

Far fewer birds were present than in previous years and there was fewer waterfowl. I added red-necked grebe and brant to my year list. Only 23 species were seen, when usually there would be between 30-50.

I only went halfway out the Blanche Peninsula as the road was very soft and had big ridges in the mud. I did not want to take the risk of going off the road, so I turned around. Noticeable were American robins and dark-eyed juncos migrating through the area.

With March being over and the first batch of migrants in, it will probably be three weeks or so of birding doldrums due to winter birds moving out and the next batch of migrants arriving. The next batch should include tree swallows, osprey, yellow-rumped warblers, palm warblers, swamp sparrows, blue-headed vireos and ruby-crowned kinglets. Winter wrens should also start arriving around then.

Andrew Hirtle of First South noticed his first American robins back and mallards have returned to his pond. They traditionally nest on his property. A

student from the Community College Environmental Class reported seeing a killdeer near the Walmart parking lot.

These birds breed and somehow successfully raise young in that busy area every year. On March 26 Barbara McLean of Lunenburg had 30 American goldfinches and a common grackle show up, along with two pine warblers and a brown creeper. On that day, she saw 25 American robins and a red-winged blackbird at Second Peninsula. Eric Mills spotted a thick-billed murre in Lunenburg Harbour on March 30.

On March 28 Paolo Metteucci saw a yellow-bellied sapsucker at the St. Mary’s Boat Club. The next day, Ray Wershler reported that the common gull was continuing at the Micmac Mall parking lot in Dartmouth.

Natalie Barkhouse-Bishop noted that the Russell Lake osprey had returned. Kathleen MacAulay and Alix d’Entremont located a black brant at Chebogue with 70 brant. On March 30 Tony Millard heard two winter wrens singing at Cape Forchu.

To make things a bit easier

When looking for information a while ago, I phoned a local business. I wasn't quite as prepared as I like to be.

Some of us, you know, like to have all our questions lined up beforehand so we are clear about exactly what we need to know. It's business-like; efficient for everyone involved. And it goes along nicely with that Choice Theory concept of knowing what you want. It's helpful to know what you want because when you do, you'll know when you have it.

But for this inquiry, my thoughts were vague and my questions were muddled, so they did, in fact, accurately reflect my situation. That is, I didn't know exactly what I wanted. I wasn't even completely sure what to ask so I could find out what I wanted to know.

I apologized for this. To my surprise, the proprietor responded with, "Don't worry. We're here to make it easier for you."

What an encouraging response! And along with that encouragement, this response conveyed what I see as a delightful clarity about the purpose of the business.

One of what Dr. Glasser refers to as the "caring habits" that build relationships is encouragement. I know many of us want to be encouraging of others (and also to be encouraged ourselves). However, it can be hard to find the words and the actions that support genuine encouragement.

When said with integrity, telling someone, "I'm here to make it easier for you" strikes me as a statement of encouragement that could be helpful for many situations and in different types of relationships.

What does "making it easier" mean? We could say that we make it easier when we serve another according to their needs. This could involve actions, words, and in some circumstances, maybe even a hug.

Making it easier could mean shovelling a snowbank or making a meal.

Making it easier could mean reaching out to someone who is feeling alone. It could mean offering a different perspective, one that helps a person look at life with satisfaction rather than despair. Making it easier could mean helping someone figure out how to improve a damaged relationship.

However, before we embark on well-meaning efforts to make it easier, it's important to ask permission to do so. My phone call seeking advice essentially gave the person on the other end of the line permission to help me. Ultimately, it is up to each of us to choose to accept someone's help to make it easier for us or not.

If someone declines what we might believe is our generous assistance, we need to respect their choice. Otherwise, we wouldn't be making it easier at all, would we?

In a perfect world, businesses and relationships who adopt a "make it easier" approach would thrive, whereas others would wither away. Not everything works that way. Thus, the "reward" that one might expect from our efforts to make things easier doesn't always appear, at least not immediately. As you know, doing only good things doesn't guarantee that only good things will happen to us. Reality can be annoying.

Liverpool Affordable Housing Development build delayed again

LIVERPOOL - Queens Neighbourhood Co-operative Housing Ltd. (QNCH) has asked Region of Queens council to allow them to push back the start of construction on a planned 30-unit affordable housing development off Lawrence Street until Aug. 31, 2025.

The co-operative bought the parcel of municipal land from the Region with the condition construction on the site would begin by June 30, 2024. When design and preliminary work took longer than expected the group requested an extension until Dec. 31, 2024. Facing continued delays in completing that work, QNCH is once again asking Queens Council to extend the start of construction until the end of August.

QNCH had originally completed a full project design for 26 units in May 2024, and had submissions for site plan approval and building permit. However, in talks with Canada Mortgage and Housing Corporation (CMHC), the co-operative learned that the Lawrence Street Project's design at 26 units, would not meet the minimum 30 units required to qualify for the small to medium urban centre Co-operative Housing Development Program (CHDP) funding.

In a letter to council from the Co-operative's consultant Michael Blair, the organization indicates they are making progress as they have secured capital funding and are finalizing CMHC financing. Blair says the tendering process is complete and they are currently in negotiations. The group didn't realize the extension they were granted had expired on Dec. 31, 2025, which is why they brought the matter to council's attention.

Blair goes on to say QNCH anticipates a construction start date this spring but are asking for the extension at the end of August to provide a buffer.

Region of Queens council received the report and granted the Aug. 31, 2025, extension.

The proposed 30 units will be spread across two, two-story buildings and house 20 one-bedroom, eight, two-bedroom, and two, three-bedroom units. The QNCH has set a goal for the project of providing affordable rental housing options with a focus on seniors in the community.
