Lunenburg looks back in time

LUNENBURG - A time capsule, buried 25 years ago was opened in Lunenburg on June 7 as part of the town's birthday.

Lunenburg students and residents gathered artifacts and sealed them in a metal box which they placed in the ground at the UNESCO flags in Town Square on Heritage Day February 21, 2000. The millennium time capsule was marked with a stone plaque which indicated it was to be opened June 7, 2025.

About 50 members of the community gathered at the flag poles Saturday on Lunenburg's 272nd birthday. Following an address by Mayor Jamie Myra, MLA Susan Corkum-Greek and Councillor Debbie Dauphinee, the assembly

watched as a public works crew lifted the container from the earth and unsealed it to reveal the contents.

Inside, protected in sealed plastic bags were several documents. Letters, photos, school yearbooks, a newspaper and town council minutes were among the many papers that offered a peak into Lunenburg life in the year 2000. The assembled crowd delighted in diving into the documents and reliving memories, sharing stories and learning about what people thought was important enough to preserve.

Town officials say the artifacts will be placed on display at town hall in the next few weeks. Residents and visitors will have the opportunity to peruse the collection before the items will be returned to their original owners.

The town is also making plans to bury another time capsule later this year.

MODL joins calls to halt uranium exploration pending public consultation

MODL - The Municipality of the District of Lunenburg (MODL) has joined three other municipalities in asking the provincial government to pause uranium exploration until they can properly consult with Nova Scotians.

Mayor Elspeth McLean-Wile says MODL, Pictou, Annapolis, and West Hants each decided on their own to send letters to the premier's office after receiving overwhelming feedback from residents concerned about the potential to begin mining uranium in their municipalities.

Premier Tim Houston's government lifted the ban on uranium exploration in February during the spring sitting of the legislature and added uranium to its list of

priority critical minerals May 14, leading to a subsequent request for exploration proposals from the province.

In the letter sent on behalf of council to the premier on June 11, the mayor writes, "Council has received many thoughtful submissions from individuals and groups who are concerned about uranium mining. They have passionately noted that the process for uranium mining carries high risks to the environment and human health. They have also clearly articulated that the removal of the ban and the issuance of RFPs for exploration happened too quickly and failed to provide an opportunity for public engagement or First Nations consultation. Council shares their concerns."

McLean-Wile goes on to say that opposition to the premier's proposal is mounting, "The momentum of concern around

this issue continues to grow in our District. There is serious concern that the government has advanced this resource development idea too quickly, with disregard for genuine consultation."

Citizens and organized groups have been lining up in opposition to the proposed uranium mining, creating social media pages, starting petitions, and holding meetings in communities across the province. Assembly of Nova Scotia Mi'kmaq Chiefs immediately went public with their opposition saying they must be consulted prior to any mineral exploration in Nova Scotia.

Canadian Association of Physicians for the Environment (CAPE) has issued a letter to the premier and warns the dangers of uranium mining are unlike those

Small tax bump, big infrastructure project highlight Mahone Bay budget

MAHONE BAY - Property owners in Mahone Bay will pay slightly more in property taxes this year.

Mahone Bay town council approved the 2025-26 operating budgets at their June 10th council meeting, increasing the residential rate to \$1.121 per \$100/assessment and commercial to \$3.081 per \$100, a \$0.01 per \$100/assessment hike for both rates.

Council also moved the full cost of fire protection services to the fire rate which has also gone up by \$0.005 to \$0.219 per \$100. The rate increases will provide the town with an operating budget of \$9.22 million to cover general operations, fire, and utility budgets.

In a press release accompanying the announcement Mayor Lohnes-Croft said, "The budget process has been informative and rigorous, and we believe it's led to a solid, forward-looking plan for our town.

This year's budget also represents more than \$10 million in external funding secured by our team, a major investment in the future of our beautiful town and the improvements that matter most to our community."

Council held a series of meetings to complete this year's budget over and

spent many hours around the council table to establish the town's priorities and determine appropriate levels of funding. Those meeting are available to view on the town's YouTube channel.

Lohnes-Croft said it was important to council that residents felt included and understand why and how they arrived at their budget, "We've also been working closely with town staff to make the budget documents clearer and easier to understand. We want the process to be as open and transparent as possible, and we expect to keep improving how we share this information with you in the years to come."

Some of the projects and initiatives in the 2025-26 operating budgets include:

- Continuing to improve the town's asset management program to support Council decision-making on capital projects.
- Community beautification initiatives with Mahone Bay Tourism & Chamber of Commerce and Communities in Bloom.
- Utilizing Canada Mortgage & Housing Corporation Housing Accelerator funding obtained by the town to support the development of new housing stock in Mahone Bay.
- Environmental initiatives including the development of an Urban Forest Management Plan and canopy restoration projects.

est Management Plan and canopy restoration projects.

- Increased grants and subsidies for community organizations delivering cultural and recreational programing for residents.
- Stormwater initiatives to explore opportunities to reduce flood risk in Ernst Brook watershed.
- New shared services with neighboring municipalities including occupational health & safety and procurement, and additional capacity for our Regional Emergency Management Organization.

Town council also set the 2025-26 capital budget at \$17.04 million, \$10.08 million (59 per cent) of which is

projected to come from external funding. The general and utility budgets include approved new and ongoing capital expenditures.

The town's major capital project for 2025-26 is Edgewater Street Project which aims to improve and beautify public spaces on Edgewater Street and expand the living shoreline. The municipality will take the opportunity the project presents to coordinate upgrading and extending municipal services. The project also includes plans to build a raised multi-use trail along the shoreline for pedestrians and cyclists.

Tender awarded for bandstand restoration

LUNENBURG – The Lunenburg bandstand, an iconic piece of history, has been closed since May 2024, but work will soon begin.

The tender was awarded to DORA Construction Ltd. At the June 10 town council meeting, for \$328,642.55+ HST and work is expected to take about 12 weeks.

"I am very relieved. We have been dealing with this for about 13 months. We're happy to get this project moving and it is just one that has been lingering," said Mayor Jamie Myra. "Our goal was to have it ready for our lighting of the trees event and our holiday festival. So, it looks like we're headed in that direction."

The work should be completed sometime in October.

Along with this good news, Myra was also happy that it came in under budget.

"It's under budget by a couple of thousand dollars, so not a lot, but it is under budget so we're very pleased," he said.

Council had pre-approved money

for the bandstand restoration project for the town's 2025/26 capital budget on March 11, 2025 for \$345,000 (including net HST) with funding from capital reserves.


During an engineering inspection conducted last year, serious structural issues were identified, and it was recommended to close the bandstand to public access immediately.

The scope of the construction includes the replacement of the steel deck; new wood decking, trim boards and hardware; abrasive blasting and re-coating of the steel columns; and a new wood accessibility ramp.

Also, as an addition to the main tender, DORA Construction was awarded a tender to supply and install new wood painted railings and benches to match the appearance of the existing structure.

The new railings and benches add \$6,736.50 to the tender submission price. This brings the final total to \$328,642.55. Town staff have also recommended that the existing ornament be repaired and re-attached, which is included in the price of the tender.

In praise of roundabouts

The Editor,

Driving home to Garden Lots yesterday I witnessed another car going through the four-way stop at Lilydale. Fortunately, no one was hit, but it made me reflect on the number of people killed, injured, or left grieving, that I have treated in my 30+ year medical career.

These “accidents” occur primarily at the Lilydale and Frank’s Corner Automotive interchanges. There appears to be lots of room to accommodate roundabouts at each of these sites, and studies show that 90 per cent of accidents can be avoided if these were built. Injuries are much less serious roundabouts are in place.

I was impressed on trips to European countries by how frequently roundabouts are used, and it mystifies me why we persist in using four-way or two-way stops at high-risk intersections. Roundabouts are more eco-friendly, using less lights, and full stops are not always necessary - saving energy, fuel, wear and tear, and helping bicyclists maintain momentum.

It wouldn’t be surprising if someone sued the highways department for the



loss of a loved one, as “accidents” at these intersections are entirely predictable and just a matter of time until roundabouts are built.

Health care costs for just one of my patients who are injured can run into tens of thousands of dollars. The total for all would be millions of dollars at these two intersections alone.

How many more deaths or school buses running off the road do we need before someone recognizes a different intersection strategy is needed? Roundabouts should be used far more extensively to prevent accidents and their lifelong sequela of pain and grief.

of other minerals, as uranium is both chemically toxic and radioactive.

On their website CAPE says claims that mining uranium in Nova Scotia is as safe as mining in Saskatchewan are false, “Industry voices say Nova Scotia can follow Saskatchewan’s example. But Saskatchewan’s uranium mines are remote at 600 km from any population centre. Nova Scotia is small, densely populated, and has far higher precipitation, making contamination risks far greater. Radon, meanwhile, travels invisibly through air and water, and even small disturbances in uranium deposits can increase its spread.”

MODL Councillor Allison Smith put forward the motion at the June 10 MODL council meeting proposing the municipality write Premier Houston and ask for a pause on any uranium exploration until the public could be properly consulted. Smith says since the announcement, she and her fellow councillors have been hearing from large numbers of residents who don’t want anything to do with uranium mining. “Momentum is really building around this. I’ve been to some community meetings and they’re only getting bigger.”

MODL Mayor Elspeth McLean-Wile

says the decision to explore uranium mining came as a big surprise to many people, “The message we’re getting loud and clear is there hasn’t been consultation. There wasn’t any notification that this was going to happen, and people are really concerned that there has not been notification given, and that Mr. Houston did not campaign on this. This given the history of uranium in this province.

On June 12, NDP Natural Resources Critic Lisa LaChance issued a release stating their caucus learned the Nova Scotia government received no response for their request for proposals by the Wednesday, June 11 deadline. Lachance raised concerns that Houston’s government moved ahead with removing the ban without consulting communities, property owners or people worried about their wells and ignored the constitutional responsibility to consult with First Nations.

Lachance has several questions for the Houston government, “Who is driving this agenda? Where is this urgency coming from when Nova Scotians didn’t ask for this, and there doesn’t seem to be interest from the industry? Instead of railroading people’s rights and ignoring valid concerns, the premier needs to come clean with Nova Scotians about his agenda.”

As this story was about to be filed,

the province announced a “New phased approach to industrial approval process to support responsible, faster metal mining projects”. The release indicates the province is streamlining the application process and providing a “clearer path for metal mining projects” that will allow mining companies to “move from planning to action faster while still upholding strong environmental safeguards.”

The release quotes Mining Society of Nova Scotia President Christian West who says, “The Mining Society of Nova Scotia welcomes the Government of Nova Scotia’s engagement with our industry and our members, which has contributed to this initiative that we expect will improve the efficiency of the permitting process, all the while maintaining high environmental standards to develop projects that are indeed in the public good.”

Notably absent from the government release is any mention of consultation with environmental advocates in the development of the new metal mining approvals process.

MODL will receive a staff report on the critical mineral strategy, the regulatory process for uranium exploration and mining, and the potential impact of mining on the LaHave River watershed at their June 17 meeting.

Annual Privateer Days festival will have some fun for everyone

LIVERPOOL – Don’t be alarmed!!

On the weekend of June 27-29 you may see some irregular activity around the Liverpool area, but do not panic. Please. Do not panic.

Just to let you know what is going on...you are not in a time warp...but think 1780...there may be some pirates, some privateers and a whole lot of people invading your town for the annual Privateer Days Festival – a Nova Scotia Signature event.

The fun kicks off on Friday evening and continues right through until Sunday evening with fun for all ages.

Chair of the board of directors, Min Smale, said that this year’s event just keeps growing as the date approaches.

“We keep adding stuff daily and we are able to really expand what we are doing,” she said, adding that more and more sponsors continue to come on board and the organizing committee keeps finding more things to put that they can sponsor.

She added that many long-term sponsors, who took a bit of a break during the COVID-19 years, have returned such as Atlantic Lottery, Midland Trucking, Mersey Seafoods and Mersey Pharmachoice.

Helping make this year’s event a success is the growth of the organizing team that went from about five people to 10-12 this year, which Smale said really makes things a lot easier.

One of the highlights of each festival is the parade that begins Saturday at 11 a.m. This year, it is expected there will be about 30 entries, making this a don’t-want-to-miss event.

“Last year was great and we are hoping it will be just as big this year or bigger,” said Smale, adding that they are not going to turn away anyone if they have time to come and fill out a form before line-up.

“It’s about community spirit, getting together and celebrating our history, culture and community.”

The vendor count, including food trucks and artisans, also jumped up from last year to 90 from about 60, “and I thought we blew it out of the park last year.”

The musical line-up has also expanded by bringing back the culture and beer garden with the Atlantic Lottery stage with 25 acts starting at 5 p.m. Friday night and continuing through to 1 a.m. Saturday morning. The music kicks off at noon Saturday and again continues through to the wee hours of the morning.

Sunday, following the church service scheduled for 11 a.m., more acts will follow with music continuing until about 7 p.m.

All about the alder flycatcher

Bird Notes

I was privileged to both hear and see my first alder flycatcher for the year at Bell Cove Road in Dublin Shore on June 7.

The alder flycatcher nests from Alaska, Yukon, Mackenzie, Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba, Ontario, Quebec and to Newfoundland and Nova Scotia, in British Columbia, Minnesota, Wisconsin, Michigan, New York, New England and in the Appalachian Mountains to Maryland. They winter from Nicaragua and Costa Rica to Colombia and Ecuador.

They are 13.1 to 15 cm long with a wingspread of 19.4 to 22.5 cm. They are brown-olive above and there is a white throat with olive sides and there are two white bars in each wing and a white eye-ring.

In flight, the alder flycatcher catches many beetles (at least 65 species), aphids, and scale insects, bees, wasps (about 41 per cent of food). They also eat crane flies, robber flies, houseflies, bugs, moths and caterpillars, grasshoppers, and occasionally dragonflies, spiders, millipedes, elderberries, blackberries and other berries.

On June 5, Logan Moore and Alix d’Entremont sighted 70 sooty shearwaters off Port Mouton Island and Keji Seaside Adjunct. Kevin Lantz discovered a northern pintail at Back Oler Farm Marsh on June 7. On June 9 Jason Dain reported two sooty shearwaters and a common murre near Pearl Island. Jason commented that at this point, razorbills outnumbered puffins for nesting on Pearl Island. There was also a common murre on the island.

On June 6 Andrew Bates sighted two great-crested flycatchers at the Middleton Wellfield Trail. On June 8 Tony Millard heard a northern house wren singing beside his house at Cape Forchu and his wife Angie had a northern mockingbird.

Mark Dennis heard an indigo bunting at Quinns Falls Road in Clyde River. He had a purple martin at Bac-

caro Light. On June 6 John Gainer reported two American oystercatchers at Jersey Cove on Cape Breton Is-

land. Kathleen MacAulay noted that a black tern had been spending time at North Brothers Island over the past week.

Kyle d’Entremont reports that a scarlet tanager continues at Hebron. Ronnie Van Dommelen located a warbling vireo at Van Nostrand Pond. On June 8, Diane LeBlanc heard an olive-sided flycatcher singing at Quinns Falls Road. Kathleen MacAulay and Alix d’Entremont found a little blue heron at Egypt Road. Angie Millard discovered a snowy egret at Cape Forchu. Eric Mills found four eastern bluebirds on Brier Island. Ronnie d’Entremont watched five sandhill cranes at Belleisle Marsh. On June 9 Eric Mills reported a northern mockingbird and a common gallinule on Brier Island. Dominic Cormier watched a tri-coloured heron fly past at Hartlen’s Point on June 11.

Pieces of the past

We can only act in the present day. We already know that, but sometimes it helps to get a reminder. Even though we might like to change what we’ve done (because we’re so much wiser now, right?) we can’t undo or redo anything. We can’t go back and act in the past.

Despite that blunt reality, here are a few points that could be worth considering.

1. We can act in the present. Even though we can’t redo or undo the past, we can act now in ways that could change the present-day results of past events.

For example, James hasn’t been on speaking terms with his dad for years. The original dispute flared up long ago as the result of an incident. It doesn’t matter now what the incident was. At this stage, it may not even matter who was right and who was wrong.

Now the question for James is, “Do you want to have a better relationship with your father?” James may decide yes or no; that’s a choice he can make in the present day.

If James decides that he would like an improved relationship, then he can take steps toward having that. Of course, if his father doesn’t want to co-operate, well, that’s his choice also, isn’t it?

But at least then James will know whether or not he can improve the current relationship. Working on the relationship now won’t change the past, but it could change the present.

2. We can get information from the past. We can learn from it. And that information can inform the choices we make in the present. The preferable outcome would be that we make better, satisfying choices in the present based on what we’ve learned in the past.

For example, Sally has a strong moral urge to assist people who are down-and-out. Over the years, she has seen that some people use her help as a stepping stone to become more responsible, capable, and appreciative. In contrast, others become more dependent, now having an expectation that Sally will continue helping them.

If Sally chooses to look clearly at

the information she has learned from past efforts, she can use it to make more satisfying decisions about what she does and who she helps today. We don’t always like the information we get. However, just because we don’t like it doesn’t mean it’s not useful.

3. We can gain perspective from the past. It is easy to lose perspective about the present, especially if the present is upsetting for us. We hear about “the current thing” and it’s usually bad. We can find ourselves longing for the old days, when everything was simple and good, everyone got along, etc.

Like many on the South Shore, I have collected bits and pieces of information, clippings, photographs, handwritten notes, pieces of the past. Some are from many years past, in those good old days when electricity was a novelty, when gardening required a team of oxen, and when even having a photograph taken was restricted to very special occasions.

These pieces are a good reminder that while progress is in some ways upsetting, progress in other ways makes for a much more satisfying and comfortable life.

Always on? Why that’s always a problem

What if we stop pretending that salary means sacrifice.

Somewhere along the way, salaried workers, especially those in management, absorbed the belief that being available 24/7 is a badge of honour.

It isn’t. It’s a warning sign.

I was recently in conversation with a high-level manager who said something that struck me:

“I get that employees want work-life balance... but if you’re a manager, you’re kind of always on shift.”

This comment wasn’t unusual, but it is outdated. It got me thinking about the dangerous expectations we’re still placing on salaried employees, especially in 24-hour operations.

THE EVOLUTION OF WORK AND WHY IT MATTERS

Today’s workforce is different. Younger employees, wisely, insist on drawing clearer boundaries between work and life. And while some older leaders might roll their eyes or feel envious, many are beginning to understand that this is a shift worth respecting.

We all need time away from work. Everyone. Even, and especially, those in leadership roles.

Burnout, turnover, resentment. These aren’t personality flaws. They’re the outcomes of systems that treat salaried staff like they signed up for a lifetime subscription to stress.

We’ve bought into the myth that leadership means constant availability. But if we want our managers to lead effectively, they need to be able to log off.

IN A 24-HOUR OPERATION, SOMEONE MUST BE AVAILABLE. BUT NOT EVERYONE. ALL THE TIME.

Yes, in a 24-hour operation, there must be a clear path to escalate serious issues. Emergencies happen. But let’s be clear: this doesn’t mean the most senior person needs to be “kind of always on.”

Here’s what works better:

- * A clear chain of command
- * Smart scheduling that includes built-in accountability
- * Real decision-making power for those left in charge during off-hours

If a manager finishes their shift and believes

they’ll probably get a call before the night is over, that’s not leadership. That’s liability. And it creates an environment where nobody ever feels off duty, even when they technically are.

THE SUNDAY NIGHT E-MAIL PROBLEM

Here’s another common scenario: the salaried employee logging on Sunday night to clear their inbox or prep for Monday morning. When asked why, the answer is usually the same: “If I don’t do it now, I’ll never catch up.”

But what’s the message behind that? Often, it’s this: I’m doing more than I’m paid for, just to keep up with what’s being asked of me.

If a job can’t be done within the hours allocated, that’s not a reflection of the employee’s performance. That’s a red flag about the workload or the expectations behind it.

If we don’t name it, it becomes the norm. The workload keeps coming. The late-night reports become expected. The line between work and rest disappears completely.

WHAT’S THE REAL COST OF BEING “ALWAYS ON”?

If you’re salaried, ask yourself:

- * Does working off-hours make me more productive or just more depleted?
 - * Do I feel more valuable... or more taken for granted?
 - * Am I doing this out of choice... or obligation?
- And if you’re a leader of salaried employees, ask:
- * Am I unintentionally reinforcing a culture of overwork?
 - * Have I created safe space for my team to set boundaries without guilt?
 - * Do I model healthy disconnection... or quiet compliance?

A SYSTEM THAT PROTECTS PEOPLE, PROTECTS THE BUSINESS

The best work happens when people feel safe to rest. When they’re able to leave work and know they won’t be pulled back in. When leadership doesn’t come at the cost of someone’s health, family, or sanity.
