## Canada Post strike update

NATIONAL - On May 25, the Canadian Union of Postal Workers (CUPW) met with federal mediators to respond to the latest offer from Canada Post and it was expected that the two will continue negotiations at least for the next few days.

Meanwhile, the more than 55,000 Canada Post workers are sticking with their national overtime ban (put in place May 23) as talks continue. CUPW was in a strike position as of 12 a.m. May 23.

On May 28 the company gave the union its final offer, in this deal Canada Post made some concessions with the Canadian Union of Postal workers, including an end to compulsory overtime and a signing bonus of up to \$1,000.

But the Crown Corporation stuck to its original proposal for a 14 per cent cumu-

lative wage hike over four years, and also said it would continue their usage of part-time staff on weekend shifts. These issues have become major sticking points in the talks between the two parties.

On May 30 Canada Post asked Job Minister Patty Hajdu to force a vote of the Canadian Post workers on the recent proposal of the crown corporation.

However, according to CUPW, the union was assured that the minister would continue to play an intermediary role in the bargaining process and would not intervene as of May 30.

On May 31 Union members around the country rallied as a way to protest against the company's final offer.

On June 1 the CUPW claimed that the Canada Post Corporation refused the CUPW formal request to resolve all outstanding issues through fair, final, and binding arbitration for both bargaining units.

## Forty-three new Canadians sworn in at ceremony

LUNENBURG – Forty-three new Canadians from 12 different countries were sworn in as Canadian citizens May 29 at the Lunenburg Academy. This was also part of citizenship week, with similar events held throughout the country.

Judge Joan Mahoney led the ceremony, along with special guest speakers MLA Susan Corkum-Greek and Town of Lunenburg Deputy Mayor of the Town of Lunenburg.

“It’s always a good time to reflect on the privileges and responsibilities that we all share as Canadian citizens,” said Judge Mahoney. “In particular, it is a good time to reflect on Canada’s history, culture and achievements. It’s an exciting time to become a Canadian citizen.”

She recognized the fact that, “You each have your own unique and personal journeys on your path to the ceremony today. People come to Canada for all sorts of different reasons...”

“Whatever your journey, you met your challenges with strength and determination. You adapted to a new culture, perhaps a new climate... and some of you added English or French to the languages that you spoke when you arrived. You made lots of tough adjustments; you made a decision in favour of Canada.”

She added that there are a lot of pluses of living in Canada such as the right to vote, but added that rights come with responsibilities such as promoting acceptance and respect for others, helping others and protecting the environment.

She added that the “rights and freedoms didn’t come for free. We stand on the shoulders of thousands of brave Canadians who have served our country in uniform.”

Judge Mahoney added...

“You’ve chosen Canada and today, I’m delighted to say that Canada has declared in favour of you.”

Corkum-Greek said that she was inspired by those that made the choice to leave their home country for Canada and said she looks forward to hearing everyone’s stories.

“I am captivated by your bravery. That it takes to leave a place and all that you know and head to a new country and a new community. I’m inspired by the faith you put in us, in Canada, as a place to build your own future and the futures of your family. But most of all I am grateful that



you have chosen to make your life in Canada and Nova Scotia.”

Bailey added...

“Earning citizenship as you have is a testament to your perseverance, dedication and the belief in the values that we have as Canadians which is respect for diversity, commitment to democracy and a deep sense of community.”

One of the new Canadians taking the Oath of Citizenship was Kalwant Singh Thiara, a 25-year-old from India who has been living in Halifax for the past four years and said that he has been enjoying his time here. “It’s great. Canada is a country of opportunities.”

He now has his own courier company and pita store.

Moira Creighton from Pleasantville moved here 60 years ago from New Zealand. The 84-year-old said that she just decided that now was the time to get the paperwork finished and become a citizen.

Drew Hutchinson moved to Canada seven years ago, from Australia and now resides in New Germany with his wife Ilona (originally from Ontario) and kids Quinn (6), Lachlan (4) and Akos (2).

Drew said that the two of them met while Ilona was travelling through Australia on holidays.

After they were married, they decided to check out the Atlantic region and landed in New Germany.

Drew applied for permanent residency with family sponsorship. He now works in Kentville for the province.

Also taking part in the ceremony was a group of young singers including Thea Cavicci, Ella Ernst and Sofia Andreu, led by Mary Knickle who sang the national anthem and sang about the Castle on the Hill referring to the Lunenburg Academy.

Several RCMP officers were also in attendance dressed in their red serge.

### CELEBRATION OF UNITY

Following the ceremony, everyone was invited to gather to enjoy a short celebration of unity, which included songs by the Corbies and the Bluenose Academy Band and Choir.

Friends and family joined in the celebration along with students from the Academy’s pre-primary program, Bluenose Academy and Pentz schools.

Included in the program was a circle of unity with everyone holding hands, circling the Academy, while a drone hovered overhead and took photos.

# Fishermen's Memorial Hospital earns ENERGY STAR® certification for 2024

LUNENBURG - Fishermen's Memorial Hospital in Lunenburg has become the first hospital in Nova Scotia to earn the prestigious ENERGY STAR certification.

This achievement places the South Shore facility among an elite group of only seven hospitals nationwide that have met the ENERGY STAR standard.

An ENERGY STAR-certified building is known for its outstanding energy efficiency and environmental stewardship. In 2024, the hospital achieved an ENERGY STAR score of 92, meaning it is more energy-efficient than 92 per cent of similar buildings across Canada. The certification reflects dedication to reducing energy consumption, lowering operating costs, and cutting greenhouse gas emissions.

Hospital officials, supporters and staff celebrated the occasion with a ceremony earlier in May where Nathaniel Schrader of EfficiencyOne presented a commemorative certificate and plaque to hospital site lead and health services manager Troy Routledge.

"This award is a testament to the strong partnership between EfficiencyOne and Nova Scotia Health to implementing these smart and sustainable solutions to improving building performance, while maintaining the highest standards of patient care," said Schrader. EfficiencyOne is a provider

of energy efficiency and carbon mitigation services based in Nova Scotia

The plaque and certificate will be displayed in the hospital entrance, serving as a visible reminder of the site's dedication to environmental stewardship and a greener future.

"Our facility had to be professionally verified that we operate more energy efficiently than at least 75 per cent of similar buildings nationwide," John Hann, Nova Scotia Health's director of maintenance and operations, told those gathered at the event. "We had to confirm the building operates in accordance with industry standards for indoor environmental quality."

Hann credited the site's environmental stewardship program, managed by Robert Barss, and the partnership with EfficiencyOne as playing major roles in the program's success. "I appreciate your efforts and what you did," Hann said, noting Nova Scotia Health has been taking steps to improve energy efficiency across all its facilities.

"To date, the hospital's environmental stewardship program has implemented energy savings projects that have reduced almost 34,000 tons of greenhouse gas emissions and saved nearly \$6 million annually," Hann added. "Our little program has done a lot for Nova Scotia Health, in my opinion."

As the largest employer in the province, with over 220 hospitals, health centres, clinics and related facilities, the organization plays a key role in environmental responsibility. Hospitals consume significant amounts of energy, water, and materials, making sustainability efforts essential.

"At Fishermen's Memorial Hospital, the focus on energy improvements took place in areas such as our building automation systems which manage the programming, scheduling and sensors that detect heating, ventilation, air conditioning, humidity and CO2."

Site lead Troy Routledge credited Barss and the maintenance and operations team for leading the environmental charge in helping the hospital save over \$140,000 annually through its green commitments.

"We're protecting both our public health and the environment," Routledge said. "We are proud to lead by example."

In line with the mission at Nova Scotia Health – to create healthy communities for generations – the efforts made to earn this recognition also enhances the patient experience and creates better workspaces for health care providers.

Self-sufficiency programs are taking shape in major hospital renovations and expansions across the province. At the same time, sites are looking for opportunities to become more environmentally conscious where it makes sense.

For example, All Saints Hospital in Springhill has upgraded its laundry facilities, replacing aging washers and dryers with high-efficiency models that support bigger loads, improve workflows, and create safer work environments.

## Abigail is off to the Worlds

BROOKLYN – A rising star in the judo world, Abigail Smith of Brooklyn, is realizing her dream of competing in the Cadet (U18) World Championships.

Smith, 17, will compete for Team Canada in Bulgaria this August.

To guarantee her spot on the national team she would have had to win a national title at the championships held in Calgary during the long weekend. However, she fell short of that goal, but still came away with a bronze medal in the U18 division.

“I was pretty upset with my result. I went there to win. I’ve been training to win. The aim this year was to win a gold medal and be the national champion, but I came up just a bit short in one of my matches,” she said.

“The main reason that I wanted to win is that I wanted to go to the cadet world championships this year, so when I lost, I was so upset because my dream was to go to the worlds for cadets.”


Not too long after the competition though, she received a call from her coach, saying that Team Canada wanted her to join the team in Bulgaria.

She was left speechless and over-the-top excited and can’t wait for the challenge.

### BACK TO THE NATIONALS...

In the U18 division, she won her first match but lost her second and had to battle back to win a few more to claim the bronze.

“Personally, I think, having to fight



my way up after a loss to get a bronze medal, is harder than getting a gold medal, but it was worth it.”

She said, despite that loss, she wouldn’t change anything from that match.

“I think I was doing fine. I just got caught...it happens...I was dominating the whole fight and everything was looking good, but just a split second can change everything in judo,” she said.

Smith also competed in the U21 division and was able to come away with a bronze medal as well and “I was very

happy with my results,” she said.

At last year’s nationals, Smith finished with a bronze medal in the U21 division.

Smith has been living with family in Halifax for several months to further her training. She says that she will ramp things up as the national tournament draws closer, including a stint in Quebec, just before the tournament.



Team Stan's Dad and Lad will consist of forwards Ben Chisholm, MJ Cook, Dawson Peverelle, Will Chisholm, Connor Goodick, Cameroon Barnes, Alex Lynch, Konnor Benjamin, Nolan O'Brian and Brennan Coleman.

On defence will be Ewan Keays, Liam Young, Marc Sabean, Walter Flower and Ryan Hopkins. In net will be Ryder Patterson.

The 27-year-old Getson can't wait to get on the ice and thinks that it will be a pretty competitive series, and predicts that his team, Team ASP, will

come out on top in seven.

"I don't think any of us like to lose. I think the compete level will be good," he said. "Even just going up against Flower again will make me want to be a bit more competitive. I haven't been able to play against him since back in the Islanders-Moosehead days. That will be fun to bring back as well."

Getson played his minor hockey in the area including two years with the Western Hurricanes Major Bantam team, one year with the South Shore Mustangs, four-and-a-half years with the Charlottetown Islanders and a half year with the Halifax Mooseheads (where he played in the Memorial Cup) in 2018-19.

He then played with Saint Mary's University for four years, before playing in France for one year (2023-24). His best season, points-wise was in 2012-13 when he scored 50 goals and chipped in 31 assists in just 29 games. He did not play last season.

He says this is a unique chance that he couldn't pass up.

"I never really had an opportunity to play in something local like this. It's going to be a fun opportunity that I can compete against guys that I've played with and I kind of helped out and coached over the years. It's a unique mix that will be real fun to be a part of," he said, adding...

"I've had the chance over the summers to skate and do scrimmage stuff with the local guys, but not anything organized like this. I'm glad Woody (Woodworth) put this all together. Hopefully, us old folk will be able to keep up with the young guys."

Best career highlight for him?

"There were a couple of goals that I scored against Halifax that were pretty important memories for me, because I grew up a Mooseheads' fan and being able to go up against them and battle them in playoffs was good. Those are definitely some good memories."

His favourite of favourites though is scoring an overtime goal against Blainville-Boisbriand Aramda in 2018.

## The present day

We have so many opportunities to find reasons to be upset, anxious, angry, or have other difficult feelings. Your upsets might come from your personal life, from the behaviour of people close to you, such as family, community, or workplace.

If you can't find enough sources of agitation there, you can always turn on the TV, radio or computer. You won't have to work too hard to find something to get your blood boiling. If you are so inclined that is.

Some people like to spend their time in worry or outrage. You can want what you want of course; that's your choice. However, it sparks my interest when someone recognizes that their feelings are causing problems for them, but believes that they are powerless to change.

A recent summary piece by William Glasser International reminded me of an aspect of Glasser's work that can be useful in regaining control. It says, "Rather than dwelling on the past or blaming others, reality therapy helps people look at what's happening right now. The focus is on making better decisions in the present to create a more satisfying future."

So we might ask: Is there something that I can do differently right now? Are there actions that I can take that would take me down a more satisfying path?

A focus on the present does not imply that there is no value in looking back at the past or forward to the future. If we don't learn from our past, it's likely that we'll repeat our errors. Those valuable lessons we can gain from going through hard times (or good times) would be lost.

Nor do we want to ignore the future. Planning ahead is helpful! Looking to the future can motivate us to choose to sacrifice now for a more secure,

joyful future for ourselves and our loved ones. It can sustain us through short-term pain when we look to longer term gain.

Thus, focusing on the present is not about wiping out the past or ignoring the future.

However, if we get caught up focus much of our efforts on past or future, we can end up not fully participating in the time that we are in. That is, our present.

If you find yourself overwhelmed by a jumble of emotions that you can't seem to get a handle on, here's a suggestion for you.

Ask yourself, "Is this emotion about the past? The present? Or the future?"

If you determine that it's about the past, then ask, "Am I learning from my past so I won't make the same errors? Am I savouring the past, which can increase my joy in my relationships (even if they no longer exist in the present)? Or am I ruminating about perceived hurts or injustices that may be quite real, but that can't be changed now?"

If you see that it's about the future, you can ask, "Am I doing productive preparation for possible fu-

ture events? Am I anticipating with joy, perhaps increasing my satisfaction and boosting relationships? Or am I fretting about possibilities that may or may not occur, and where there is no effective action that I can take?"

In, "Choice Theory," Glasser writes, "The past is over; he cannot change what he or anyone else did." Likewise, for a good future, focus on making the life that we have right now more satisfying and effective.

I'll leave you with one more quote from Glasser, "All you have any control over is what you do right now." Do you think that deliberately choosing to focus on the present could be helpful for you? # The Eastern Phoebe is back

*Bird Notes*

It was great to see the Eastern Phoebe back at its usual location in Pinehurst on May 25.

The Eastern Phoebe nests from the Mackenzie into Saskatchewan and east to Quebec and New Brunswick, Nova Scotia and south into British Columbia, in Atlanta and southwest to South Dakota, Colorado, New Mexico, Oklahoma and into Texas, Arkansas, Tennessee, Mississippi, Alabama, Georgia, South Carolina and North Carolina.

They winter from Virginia, south through Atlantic coastal states and then west through the Gulf states and south into Mexico.

The eastern phoebe is 15.6 to 18.1 cm long with a black bill, blackish crown and upperparts of olive. There are no white bars in the wings except in immatures. The throat is white with the rest of the underparts pale buff-white. There is a pale olive colour on the shoulders and flanks. The call is distinctive and it sounds like fee-bee or wheepee.

The food of the eastern phoebe is many types of beetles, wasps, ants, small wild bees, flies, bugs, grasshoppers, crickets, dragonflies, moths,

caterpillars, spiders, millipedes, ticks, and even hairworms from water and occasionally tiny fishes from shallows.

On May 23 John Solman of Lower Rose Bay reported that a male indigo bunting was present for a third day. I saw this bird on its fourth day and a big shout out to John for allowing me to come and see it. David McCorquodale sighted a purple martin by the bridge on the Centennial Trail in Bridgewater.

On May 25, Alice Arnold of Upper Chelsea told me about a duck coming to her swimming pool. From the description I would say that it was a female mallard. In the past, in a place where I lived, a plastic swimming pool was left behind. A pair of mallards used to come regularly to it.

Alice has an American robin back, that nests in a Japanese Yew every year over her deck. She says that barn swallows are back again and more than last year, which is a good sign. A pair of bald eagles are tending at the Beaver Trail Basin. Robert Keereweer reported a Swainson's thrush at New Harbour.

At Pinehurst it was great to see bobolinks back. Kevin Lantz had two least flycatchers and an eastern wood pewee along the Centennial Trail in Bridgewater on May 26. He also dis-

covered a Baltimore oriole in Kingsburg.

On May 27, Peter Churchill spotted two male wood ducks at Laconia. Kevin Lantz found a Canada warbler along the Bay to Bay Trail. Johnny Cook reported that he has an all-white blue jay tending in Riverport and it has been around for quite some time. Allister Wentzell also told me about seeing an all-white bird at his place, so this is likely the same bird flying between north and south Riverport.

On May 19 Hiliary Van Herk discov-

ered an upland sandpiper at Fisherman's Reserve. On May 20 a summer tanager was continuing in Baddeck. JD Bharvad located a Caspian tern at Cossitt Lake in Cape Breton.

Zach Wile found two Caspian terns on May 22 at the Wallace Bay National Wildlife Area. Kathleen MacAulay sighted a purple martin at Cape Forchu on May 23. A rough-winged swallow at Belleisle Marsh has been seen by many.

Eric Mills discovered a common gallinule at Jimmy's Pond at the Big Meadows Bog on Brier Island on May 25. He had a solitary sandpiper as well. On May 26 a brown booby stopped on a fishing boat on the Bay of Fundy.

Wayne Green reported a Philadelphia vireo at Sandy Cove on May 27. David Currie discovered a blue-gray gnatcatcher at Hartlen Point. Mark Dennis saw a yellow-headed blackbird, a glossy ibis and a green heron at West Head on Cape Sable Island. Alix d'Entremont located a scarlet tanager along the Yarmouth County Rail Trail on May 28. Anne Doane saw a great egret at Sherose Island in Barrington.

# King Street bridge repairs scheduled for 2029-2030

BRIDGEWATER - King Street is one of Bridgewater's busiest streets, but over the past two years there have been delays for people who travel this route.

The Veinot bridge is the bridge that goes over Sandy Brook, the water way that connects the Wile Carding mill to the LaHave River. It is damaged and is down to one lane, requiring a traffic light on either side to direct traffic over the bridge.

The damage was caused by major flooding the county saw in 2023.

Before this flooding the Veinot bridge had been scheduled for maintenance and upgrades in 2024, to update the aging bridge's infrastructure.

The flooding in 2023, however, caused delays to the bridge's updates. Many bridges in the province were severely damaged, and in some cases completely destroyed. This caused major setbacks for updating the aging infrastructure.

Since the bridge is still passable with the addition of traffic lights, the re-construction of the bridge was pushed back.

According to the provincial government's five-year highway improvement plan, the bridge is now scheduled for repairs in 2029-2030.

Bridgewater mayor, David Mitchell was shocked when he heard this news at first, but he is hopeful that the province will move up the repair date of the bridge.

"So, we were a little bit shocked at first, when they said that it was moved out, but then after our conversation with the province. We feel that they recognize the importance of this piece of infrastructure. We're confident that it will be moved forward and we are

working with our MLA to hopefully see that move to a project timeline closer to next year."

Although the bridge took major damage it still is safe.

"Engineers for the province checked on the main bridge it is aged, and it does need to be replaced. But right now, there are no safety concerns," added Mitchell.

Last year the provincial government doubled its existing funding for the bridge program to \$60 million. The bridge program, according to the five-year highway improvement plan 2025-2026, is a program designed to help maintain Nova Scotia's 4,100 bridges,

through repairing and replacing the current bridge structure. The province claims that doing a proactive approach to bridge maintenance will improve safety and reduce costs of maintenance in the future.

Another bridge scheduled for repairs in the highway plan is the bridge on Woodstock Road that goes over the Mush-a-Mush river, just outside Mahone Bay. This bridge was also damaged in the 2023 flooding.

This bridge is scheduled for repairs in 2027-2028. This bridge is also important because it allows people who live in the Clearland community to cross the Mush-a-Mush river.
